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



Just five points separates these sides now after Leicester were humiliated 4-1 by Bournemouth at the weekend, while Sheffield Utd managed a three-goal winning margin of their own when hosting an in-form Chelsea outfit.

That certainly puts these two sides in contrasting form with the Blades having now won three of their last four unbeaten outings up against Spurs, Wolves, Chelsea and Burnley. It should be noted however, that the stalemate came against the weakest of these, Sean Dyche's outfit, as well as coming in the sole away fixture over this period, so we aren't going to get too ahead of ourselves.

In fact, Chris Wilder's men have won just one of their last eight trips, but they have been resolute as only champions Liverpool have lost fewer games than them on the road this term, while no side has drawn more than their nine times. Furthermore, three of their four defeats on their travels have come against the breakaway top two and an in-form Man Utd outfit, so it's hardly as if this is going to be a breeze for the hosts.

## 2018 Ryder Cup



This has all the makings of a classic Ryder Cup with 17 of the world top 18 ranked players on show, in what is surely the highest quality instalment of the competition since it's inauguration in 1927. The lowest ranked player from the USA's collection of stars is Phil Mickelson at 25, as they make the trip across the pond confident of defending their title.

Europe were thrashed 17-11 in 2016, but whereas Hazeltine was long and wide, this year's track, Le **Golf National** in the outskirts of Versailles, is short and narrow. It has been a mainstay on the European Tour for several years now, hosting the French Open every year since 1990 (apart from 1999 and 2001). Of course, this is all part of home advantage to try and negate the power of many of the Americans, with the driver an option on very few of the holes. Instead accuracy in dissecting this slightly quirky track will be paramount with plenty of water lurking.

#### Home advantage?

It's been quarter of a century since the USA won on European soil and it's only twice happened since the Ryder Cup changed from Great Britain to Europe in 1979. Further to that, Le Golf National is a course very familiar to the Europeans, whose team includes the last two French Open winners — Fleetwood and Noren. With that in mind, it was a little surprising that Justin Thomas was the only member of the visitors 12-man squad to take part in the French Open this year, with the only other members to have played a competitive round here being Brooks Koepka (2014) and Bubba Watson (2011), both of whom missed the cut. The driver is taken out of the equation on many holes and this is a track that requires course management, which falls hugely in Europe's favour.

USA go off as favourites, but the stats would have them very evenly matched. Add in course knowledge and we give the Europeans the edge, making them fantastic value as outsiders.

### 2019 French Open Women's Preview

#### Background

While the men's champion has been very predictable for the past decade, as Rafael Nadal has risen to be the greatest clay-courter of all time, the ladies' champion has been decidedly harder to pick.

Like the men's competition, the defending champion Simona Halep heads the market again this year, but her price is still over double that of the Spanish favourite as the women's draw remains very much wide open. However, there are some clear form trends we can use to help predict the winner:

- Since 1997, 21 of 22 champions had reached at least one semi-final in their last three tournaments, while 17 had at least two semis in their last four events
- Since 1997, 19 of 22 champions had reached at least one final in their last four tournaments
- 14 of the 19 champions since 2000 have won one of their last four tournaments

#### Quarter One

World no.1 and 2019 Australian Open champion, Naomi Osaka, heads the draw but pulled out of her Rome quarter last week with a hand injury. Should she be fit enough to play, she'll likely face Jelena Ostapenko, 2017 French Open champion, or Viktoria Azarenka, a former semi-finalist, in the second round. That may leave a door open for Rome semi-finalist Maria Sakkari, who fits our trends above. The bottom group of eight players is less threatening with last years' semi-finalist Madison Keys and home favourite Caroline Garcia the only realistic dangers.

Serena Williams will be pleased with her draw, but she too pulled out of Rome last week, leaving question marks over her fitness having played just one competitive match on the clay this season. A scheduled third round with 22nd seed Bianca Andreescu would certainly be on the cards if both players were fully fit, but the Indian Wells champion has had her own issues since withdrawing in the fourth round in Miami. That leaves this segment of the draw wide open for Ash Barty, who despite not excelling on the red surface, reached the quarters in Madrid. She beat likely second-round opponent Danielle Collins during that run as she looks to have a pretty clear route to the fourth round with the only other ranked player in this section, Su-Wei Hsieh, losing in the opening round at both Rome and Madrid.

The six qualifiers in this quarter make it considerably weaker. Osaka's section is a lot tougher than the bottom-half and her injury concerns, along with Serena's and Andreescu', means we'll side Miami Open winner Barty at a double figure price.
